AGENDA ITEMS

a) **ID 1456 Sewer Master Plan**

After the staff presentation the following people spoke at public comment:

Committee comments included the following:

- Committee members agreed with the staff recommendations on questions 1 and 2, and agreed with the 2 -3 year retroactive suggestion for fats, oils, and grease (FOG).
- Committee recommended that staff reach out to property owners regarding the plan.

b) **ID 1525 Intelligent Transportation System Draft Plan**

After the staff presentation no one spoke at public comment.

Committee comments included the following:

- Committee members thanked staff for their work on this item.
- Committee is very excited about this system.
- The smooth flow of traffic is a top priority for the community.
- Committee recommended that staff implement a public education and outreach effort to tell this story.
- Put people first on the mission statement.
- Looking forward to getting data from the system to assist with planning and funding for traffic and infrastructure.
- There is a lot of investing to get caught up on.
- Committee members were happy to see hardening of security for the system and asked how it interacted with emergency management needs.
