CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mortenson gave the presentation, which provided background information and detailed proposed updates to the Mobility Action Plan and Transportation Element to incorporate multimodal concurrency policy changes and address some minor/routine updates to keep the documents up to date.
